The mother loses her child and she didn't even know she was pregnant.

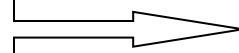

Father Kline's Corner



Parish Family,

How is your Lent going? What did you give up for Lent? What penance are you doing? Have you had the opportunity to do three things we are to do during Lent? Prayer, Fasting and Alms giving? Have you been to the Lenten Dinners or the Stations of the Cross and to an evening Mass during the week or to daily morning Masses if you are able? If we have a choice of doing a good deed, or going to Mass, or praying the Rosary or making the Stations of the Cross, the Mass is infinitely more important and we receive an infinite number of graces, especially when we receive Holy Communion.

Back when I lived in Hays. During Lent I decided to attend Mass and was astonished to see the church almost completely full every day during Lent. It was the most important thing the people would do during Lent. This made a tremendous impression on me and many people would also go to Confession during the week as well. Young, middle age and old. Lent is a time to examine our relationship with Jesus and to do the best we can to turn away from our sins, confessing them regularly before Easter.

Lent is also a good time to examine what we are also doing by way of Stewardship. To be a good steward is to be a good disciple. What gifts and talents do you have and are you sharing those during Lent for the love of God and your neighbor. Doing good deeds such as visiting the sick, praying for others, visiting the home bound and elderly and doing good works for them is what stewardship is all about. It takes sacrifice to give of our self, which blossoms from love, to be faithful in giving of our self. For most people, coming to the Adoration Chapel does not seem like a sacrifice. Because how could it be a sacrifice to be with someone we love. Yet, when we come to adore Jesus, we are sacrificing our time and making an effort to pray for others. Prayer is not always easy. It can become difficult. We don't just quit doing something because it becomes sacrificial. Rather, we persevere. Perseverance shows our love.

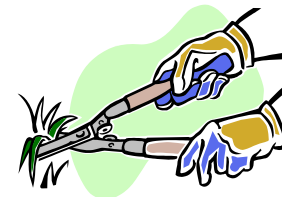
