Suggestions for Two Potential Italian Fundraiser Events

In this week's bulletin, the Altar Society has an insert which explains their new fundraiser of selling Lasagna for Super Bowl Sunday. Also in the bulletin, there is a notice to see if there is interest in continuing the Italian Dinner. I think both are great ideas. It must be noted that the organizational meeting for a Committee of the Italian Dinner is only just that. I have been assured, the purpose is only to see if there is interest in continuing the event and that there is flexibility in doing whatever the committee would decide and not one person. There are parishioners who have a sincere desire to continue something that has been very special for many years. Since both of these events could possibly fall within weeks of each other, we can work together to determine the date for the Italian Dinner that would be beneficial to the parish and community. A suggestion would be if there is enough interest in continuing the Italian Dinner, lasagna would not be served at the Italian Dinner and would be replaced by some other Italian food such as Spaghetti. This way the Altar Society's lasagna event would be special to that event. I would suggest that if the Italian Dinner would continue, the profits be divided in the following manner: 20% each to the Altar Society, CYM, Knights of Columbus, His Caring Heart Fund and local food pantries of Halstead and Burrton. I ask that if a committee be formed, it would abide by the Guidelines previously developed. But if for some reason, the Guidelines would need to be adjusted, please come and visit with me. These are suggestions, and only suggestions. I believe we can come together as a parish in unity. What I see and most importantly what the Lord sees are good hearted people in the Altar Society and those interested in continuing the Italian Dinner who have a sincere desire to give their time, talent and treasure out of love of God and neighbor. 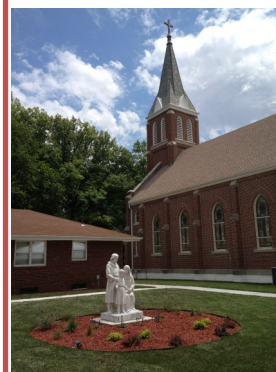
