Church Temperature

This past weekend, one person told me the church is too hot and then another person told me the church is too cold. I thought that was funny. The church temperature is set at 70 degrees. Its hard to maintain 70 when the temp is nearly a 100 degrees outside. Before Mass begins due to the opening and closing of the door, the temperature rises to 72. We recently installed new vents in the basement of the church for greater air flow. The Blessed Virgin Mary side of the church is 2 degrees warmer due to the sun shining through the stain glass windows. The outer edges of the pews next to the walls on both sides of the church one can feel the AC blow. The St. Joseph side is usually 2 degrees cooler, because the sun doesn't shine in those windows. Therefore, if you want to be cooler sit in the coolest location, on the St. Joseph side near the wall. If you want to be warmer, sit on the Blessed Virgin Mary side near the aisle. For those who are hot, we can offer it up. For those who are cold, we can offer it up and everyone else who is comfortable, you don't have that opportunity. By offering up the inconvenience of not being perfectly comfortable, we give our little sacrifice to Jesus for the conversion of sinners and out of love of Him, who endured much greater suffering for us. We can unite that sacrifice with the sacrifice Jesus offers to His Father on the altar. Just imagine what it was like for our ancestors, who had no air conditioning and yet they dressed up every Sunday. Men wore suits and ladies wore dresses and hats. And the children wore Sunday clothes. —Fr. Kline
