## Parish Center Roof

We had 4 different roofing companies look at the roof because several of the roofing companies gave us conflicting recommendations. The roof leaks we have had were caused by a roof water drain problem and also an AC unit not adequately sealed. Two roofing companies thought the main roof was leaking, but this was not actually the case. It is estimated that the current roof has 5 to 7 years before replacement is needed due to cracking and bubbling of the roof. Therefore, the Finance Council and Pastoral Council decided to not replace the roof at this time. As one roofer said, "Most people don't replace their tires until they need to."
