On December 3, 2012, 16-year-old Luke Maxwell took the family's full-size van and violently crashed into an oncoming vehicle in an attempt to kill himself. His family was shocked. Luke didn't tell anyone he had suffered from depression for four years, and he thought suicide was the only option to end his pain. Arrested for assault with a deadly weapon for seriously injuring the other driver, Luke was diagnosed with Major Depressive Disorder and started treatment. As Luke's recovery progressed, he formed teen depression support groups to prevent suicide and other self-harm. Now 18 and a college student, Luke has found redemption by becoming close friends with the man he injured in the crash and by trusting in God's plan for his life. His mission is to break the stigma of depression, bring awareness to the symptoms, give insight to parents, and let teens know that this medical condition is treatable, so hope can replace despair.
