### Reverence for the Most Holy Eucharist

When we participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass we should do so in such a way that forms the minds and hearts of our children in reverence for Almighty God, in the virtues of humility, obedience, and adoring silence. The Mass is the Holy Sacrifice of Our Lord Jesus Christ on the Cross! There should be respectful and prayerful silence before, during, and after Mass.

The Mass is not a community gathering or a “meal.” It is Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. Our focus should be on the Mystery of the Holy Trinity, the divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, and the sacrifice of Our Lord upon the Cross. The Mass is always about God and the sacrifice of His Son. We attend Mass because of the debt we owe God for our redemption!

At many Masses there is often a significant breach in reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. For example, we must be aware that when we choose to receive Holy Communion in the hand, even brief contact with the Sacred Host can leave tiny particles of the consecrated Victim. How patient must our Eucharistic Lord be when every day thousands upon thousands of these unintentional acts of desecration of the Blessed Sacrament occur around the world!

Let us never fall into careless habits which can be very harmful for our children to witness. Do we receive Our Lord casually or with bored indifference? Do we truly know and believe that the Eucharist is our Savior, our King, and our Judge? Many Catholics have a Protestant view of the Mass because they have fallen into the above mentioned bad habits.

Let us pray the Mass with humility, silence and reverence. Remember, it is the “Mystery” of our faith!
