Mass in the Extraordinary Form

Are you open to a potentially life changing experience? There are three distinct features of the Traditional Latin Mass that can do just that: silence, the use of Latin, and the orientation of the priest. These all will draw you closer to almighty God, but for now I want to focus on the importance of silence. In subsequent bulletins I will address the use of the Latin language and the orientation of the priest.

The Traditional Latin Mass is full of silence. For example, the priest prays the Eucharistic prayer inaudibly as he prays to God on behalf of the faithful. The Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ therefore become present in silence. Remember, silence does not always indicate the absence of communication, but rather, in this case, its fullness! Think of a loving mother sitting silently at the bedside of her sick child. The silence observed during the Traditional Latin Mass allows the faithful “to engage in some of the highest communication of love possible on earth...Men and women, through the vehicle of silence, are touching the face of God.” The silence is not a barrier to participation, rather it enhances it. The silence forms the basis of the faithful to contemplate the mystery of the life of Christ made present before them.

Contemplation is the highest form of prayer. If we are taking our spiritual lives seriously we should be embracing every opportunity to contemplate the mystery of our faith at highest levels of prayer.
