Neither the scout or the cookies are the problem. The problem is the licensed trademark on the boxes. When the girls sell cookies, they earn money, but only keep 10% - 20% of the sales for their own use. The local council keeps 65% - 75% & because of the licensed trademark, the Girl Scouts USA (GSUSA) get a royalty payment. The GSUSA is the largest member of the World Association of Girl Guides & Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). WAGGGS is an organization that aggressively promotes youth reproductive/abortion & sexual rights. GSUSA promotes participation in pro-abortion Women's March, praise pro-abortion, allows councils to work with Planned Parenthood. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is greatly challenged in our world today. Saint John Paul II was deeply concerned about this weakening of belief in what goes to the heart of our Catholic Christianity and identity.

The saint for the first time in history implemented Eucharistic Exposition and Adoration at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome during every weekday of the year. John Paul II hoped that Eucharistic Adoration outside of the Mass would be promoted throughout the world.

The Pope identifies the Eucharist as the Presence Sacrament. Christ is on earth. He wants to perform miracles of His grace, especially miracles of conversion in what is becoming a Christ-less age. The key to experiencing His grace is our deep faith in Christ's living presence among us in the Blessed Sacrament.

Bishops, priests, religious and laity should be open to promoting and adoring Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.
