Prayer & Salvation

As a local Church, God will only bless our efforts and ministry if we are a people of prayer. St. Paul tells us in his epistle the reasons for prayer. He reminds us that prayer pleases God our Savior, who wants all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. Unfortunately, many are not choosing for God and therefore will not be saved. The reality is that the concerted opinion of the vast weight of tradition, the fathers, the doctors, saints, mystics and popes is that the vast majority of humanity is damned. We must pray for these people. God loves the lost. We must show our love for the lost and for God through our prayer.

The Catholic Church was established by the Son of God to be the sole vehicle by which men may be brought to the Beatific Vision. There is not another “way,” or other ways or religions. Since God is one, there is only one way and that way produces a full unity with Him for eternity. That unity begins here on earth in the Catholic Church.

This dogma goes to the heart of our spiritual life. Either we are called to participate in the sacramental life of the Catholic Church to grow in holiness by cooperating with the grace of the sacraments or we are not. Satan is much more powerful than we are. How is it then possible without the cooperation of grace which flows from the Catholic Church and the constant spiritual maintenance afforded by constant access to that grace to be saved?
